

**MINUTES**  
**VILLAGE OF FLAT ROCK AGENDA WORKSHOP**  
**ASSEMBLY ROOM – VIA ZOOM**  
**MAY 3, 2021**  
**9:30 AM**

Mayor Weedman presided over the May 3, 2021, agenda meeting at 9:30 a.m. Those present in addition to Mayor Weedman were Vice Mayor Coletta, Council Members Carpenter, Dethero, Gooch, Gregory, Tiles, Village Clerk Parker and Village Administrator Christie.

**MOMENT OF SILENT MEDITATION/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

Mayor Weedman led the group in a moment of silent meditation. He then led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

**Agenda**

A draft agenda for the May 13, 2021, council meeting was presented. Under *Old Business, Item #7 – 2021/2022 Budget, #8 – Traffic Safety Advisory Committee, New Business, Item #9 – American Rescue Plan Initial Procedures, Item #10 – Committee Appointments, and Item #11 – Town Hall Meetings*, were added to the agenda. With no further changes, Council Member Carpenter made a motion to approve the amended agenda, seconded by Council Member Gooch. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

**Discussions:**

Council Member Carpenter read into record Resolution No. 225 – Resolution to Express Support and Thanks to the Henderson County, North Carolina Sheriff's Office. Council Member Carpenter made the motion to approve Resolution No. 225, seconded by Council Member Gregory. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

Mayor Weedman mentioned Myra Grant was hired to research potential grants for the funding of the stream restoration project. Myra Grant mentioned an available grant Annual Offering from the Attorney General's Environmental Fund that focuses on stream remediation and environmental projects. She explained the process in applying for the grant, and the first step is writing a letter of intent that must be filed by May 18, 2021, and the full proposal is due June 24, 2021. Myra Grant will be researching other resources up to \$500,000.00.

Mayor Weedman proposed that council members vote to remove the tributary creek from further consideration, to delay consideration of King Creek since one side of the creek is in the Staton Woods subdivision, and to put all efforts toward remediation of Dye Creek. Vice Mayor Coletta made the motion, seconded by Council Member Gooch. The motion carried by unanimous vote.


Council Member Gregory mentioned Shred Day is scheduled for May 8, 2021, 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. The Sheriff's Office will be available to receive drop-offs of prescription drugs.


Council Member Dethero reported he visited the City of Hendersonville Water & Sewer to obtain a current map of the water and sewer lines in the Village of Flat Rock.

Vice Mayor Coletta thanked council members who participated in the Litter Sweep on April 21, 2021. Ten bags were picked up along Highland Lake Road. Another Litter Sweep is planned for the fall.

Council Member Carpenter reported that the Arbor Day celebration in the Park was a success. Nine trees valued at \$1,700 were donated: (6) from Ace Hardware, and (3) from Raymond's Garden Center. The Cub Scouts and Brownies planted the trees.

With no further discussions, Council Member Tiles made a motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Council Member Gooch. The meeting adjourned at 10:03 a.m.
